1. Call to Order:

- Mayor Shea welcomed everyone viewing the meeting on the ZOOM Platform, the public meeting was called to order at 7:01PM.

- I. During the last extended power outage, some residents in Seldom experienced issues with the water and as a result items of clothing that were received for Christmas were spoiled during washing. Unfortunately some residents also experienced severe skin reactions after showering.
- II. Town Staff contacted the equipment supplier and it was determined that this was not the result of excessive chlorine going through the system, it was Soda Ash that somehow was sucked out into the watermain as a result of a vacuum created by the power outage and was an isolated one time occurrence. There was nothing that could be done by Staff to prevent this from happening at the time, however an anti-syphin valve has been ordered to hopefully correct this from happening again..

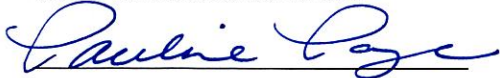
